THE 360th casualty list issued by the De-
partment of Defence was received from the

sence Department was received from the Press Association yesterday. It gives particulars of 118 casualties. Two officers are reported killed in action: 11 men died of wounds, and one man died from a cause not stated. Eight officers and 96 men are reported wounded. Of these, one officer was admitted to hospital and one was slightly wounded and remained with his unit: 89 men were admitted to hospital, five have embarked for England, and two have since rejoined their regiment. Details are as follows:—

MEN WHO HAVE FALLEN.

LIEUTENANT S. G. ROWRON.

Lieutenant S. G. Rowron, who has been wounded, is a son of Mr. George Bowron, of Bowron Bros., the well-known leather merchants, of Christchurch. Private advice states that he has lost his right eye, but his remaining eye is sound, and his other wounds not serious. He left with the fifth reinforcements.

LIEUTENANT A. F. CARMODY.

Lieutenant A. F. Carmody, who has been killed, left with the eighth reinforcements. He held a responsible position on the staff of the New Zealand Farmers' Co-operative Association in Christchurch. He was a single man, 35 years of age, and belonged to Liverpool, England. He held a commission in senior cadets, and was a keen rifle shot.

CORPORAL E. D. SNELL.

Corporal E. D. Snell, reported last week as having died from wounds, was 24 years of age in May last. He was born at Morrinsville, and received his primary education at the public school there. He won a district scholarship, and continued his studies at the Auckland Grammar School, after which he joined the Civil Service, and later on passed his matriculation and solicitor's general examinations. At the time he was accepted for military service he was studying for the law. He took a very keen interest in Sunday school and church work. Two brothers are now with the forces in France.

PRIVATE W. J. PERRY.

Private W. J. Perry, who is reported having died of wounds, was 20 years of age. He was born in England, but came to Auckland with his parents in the first year of his birth. He was educated at the Normal School, afterwards joining the staff of Messrs. J. Wiseman and Sons, Ltd., with whom he was employed for some years. Prior to enlisting he was a member of No. 3 Engineers, Auckland. He left New Zealand last October for the front. As a footballer on the local fields, he played fullback for the Newton

PRIVATE J. C. BARLOW.

Private J. C. Barlow, who has been reported wounded, is the son of the late Mr. P. W. Barlow, C.E., of Matakohe, Kaipara. His mother resides in Grey Street, Devonport. Private Barlow was educated at the Devonport school and at Mr. T. Harle Giles's college. He was a popular athlete, and he always took an active part in football at North Shore. In 1901 he was captain of the Association football team. Returning 12 months ago from Queensland, where he had been engaged in farming for two years, Private Barlow took up survey work in the Wai-kato, and has been on active service in France for some time.

PRIVATE F. BONELLA.

Advice has been received that Private Frederick Bonella was wounded in the head and hand on June 29. His name was published in a casualty list on Friday as Frederick Bone. Private Bonella is a son of Mr. John Bonella, of 10 Hayden Street, Newton.
